

WHEELCHAIRS, MANNUALLY-POWERED MOBILITY AIDS AND OTHER POWER-DRIVEN MOBILITY DEVICES (OPDMD)

Wheelchairs and Manually-Powered Mobility Aids are allowed anywhere foot traffic is allowed.

Other Power-Driven Mobility Devices (OPDMD) are permitted **ONLY FOR USE BY PEOPLE WITH MOBILITY IMPAIRMENTS** and must typically comply with the following maximum specifications in order to be considered acceptable for use on Seminole County Designated trails:

1. Speed – The operating speed while on a Seminole County Designated Trail must be that of normal walking speed, based on the particular soil type and existing environmental conditions, not to exceed 5 miles per hour.
2. Width – The width must not exceed 34 inches. Certain pedestrian routes, trails and undeveloped areas may reduce the acceptable width as the width varies greatly for these areas due to natural features or cultural landscapes.
3. Length – The length must not exceed 62 inches. Certain pedestrian routes, trails and undeveloped areas may not support the length of certain devices due to natural features or cultural landscapes.
4. Weight – The weight of the device must not exceed 550 pounds. Certain pedestrian routes, trails and undeveloped areas may not support the weight of certain devices due to natural features or cultural landscapes.
5. Type – The type must not include any motorized off-highway vehicle designed to travel on non-highway tires and/or having a seat designed to be straddled by the operator and/or handlebars for steering control, such as all-terrain vehicles (ATVs), off-highway motorcycles (OHMs) and recreational off-highway vehicles (ROV). NOTE: Gas-powered vehicles, no matter the type, are not typically allowed in any facilities enclosed by walls and/or covered by roofs.
