DESCRIBE PROJECT/PROPOSAL:

Amend the Seminole County Code of Ordinance Chapter 270 to reinstate the addition of regulations pertaining to the Seminole County Cross-Connection Program. These regulations were contained in previous revisions of the Seminole County Land Development Code and inadvertently deleted. The Cross-Connection Control Program is critical to the prevention of cross-connection hazards and other threats to the water supply.

DESCRIBE THE DIRECT ECONOMIC IMPACT OF THE PROJECT/ PROPOSAL UPON THE OPERATION OF THE COUNTY:

This amendment to the Ordinance presents no economic impact to Environmental Services Utility Operations as it is a reinstatement of the regulations in the County Code and the Cross-Connection Program is a current and on-going service.
